What's Going On Inside the Institute?

On October 14th and 15th, Gesell Institute hosted its 60th Anniversary Celebration Banquet & LEAD Conference (SEE PAGE 2).



At our very first press confernce we revealed that children are still developing in the same ways they were when Dr. Arnold Gesell examined them during the 1940's; however it is classroom curriculums that have changed. We proved that developmental abilities must emerge first before any academic curriculum has meaning for a child and that it then stimulates their desire to learn! Trying to have children perform academic tasks that are too advanced for them at a young age is unproductive for the student. Our study results have recently appeared in Harvard Education Letter, New Haven Register, New Haven Advocate, Teacher Magazine and on our local ABC affliate, WTNH News 8.



Gesell Developmental Observation-Revised, GDO-R is the newly revised developmental assessment system based on current data and updated trends. The system includes the following updated materials:

- Examiner's Manual

Gesell Early Screener, GES is a brand new screening product designed to give a quick look at a child's developmental functioning. Easily administered in 20 minutes, the GES is perfect for collecting baseline developmental data on large numbers of incoming students, and provides interpretive rubrics for children who may need further evaluation.

Parent/Guardian Questionnaire collects information regarding the child's early health history and records social, emotional, and adaptive behaviors observed by family members.

Teacher Questionnaire collects social, emotional and adaptive behaviors observed in the classroom and includes an interpretive rubric.
